Working Together to Safeguard Children 2018

- Identify children and families who would benefit from early help
- Undertake an assessment of the need for early help
- Provide targeted early help services which focuses on meeting the assessed needs of the family to achieve positive outcomes





Devon's Early Help

- Is the initial response offered by all services in contact with children, young people and families when they need extra support to thrive.
- It's not a specific service or team.
 It's an approach to working that brings together people from a range of different services and teams who will work with the whole family to help improve things for everyone.
- Early Help is an integral part of everyone's role.

'No single practitioner can have a full picture of a child's needs and circumstances'


(Working Together 2018)



- This is not about you holding a family on your own.
- It's a multi-agency approach to coordinating the right support at the right time.
- Different superheroes will be needed throughout the family's journey.
- We all play a 'superhero' role in safeguarding/supporting children and families in Early Help.



Early Help Journey



Right for Children (RfC)

- Multi Agency Information Sharing System.
- Reduces the need for families to repeat their stories.
- Supports secure information sharing between agencies.
- Used by all professionals including MASH and Childrens Social care.



The Early Help For Families Assessment

- Is consent led and identifies the purpose for offering support.
- Actively involves the family in identifying their own strengths, concerns and explores what could go better.
- Restoratively explores different ways of working that supports a 'needs' led approach.
- Encourages a multi agency response to supporting families.
- Helps the family create their plan, and agree with professionals priorities, clear outcomes, timeframes and who is responsible.

- RfAS are discussed by multi-agency partners at daily Early Help Triage meetings chaired by Locality Officers.
- Each family is discussed so that advice and support is given from the multi agency group
- Decisions are made on the appropriate service as well as signposting/information
- Please identify the needs on the RfAS-you don't have to know all the services
- Please talk to the parent about what their priority is and record that
- Please put the DOB of the adults on the RfAS




