SEND and Inclusion

The Special Educational Needs and Disability Code of Practice: 0-25 years (January 2015); states that the UK Government is committed to inclusive education of disabled children and young people and the progressive removal of barriers to learning and participation in mainstream education.

The Learner Services Advisory Teams offer support across the areas of need outlined in the Code of Practice under;

SEMH & Wellbeing Team

Ensuring provision to support children & young people's mental health is one of our top priorities

- We recognise that for many this can be an area that they feel less confident in their ability to support the most vulnerable children and young people
- We provide advice and support on an *individual basis* as well as helping schools to consider their *whole school policy* and *approach* to supporting positive emotional well-being and mental health needs

The team consists of experienced advisory teachers, family workers and specialist behaviour support workers. Supporting:

- Primary and Secondary maintained and academy settings
- ➤ Specialist settings
- ➤ Nursery transitions to school

SEMH & Wellbeing Team

Over 395 pupils have been supported last academic year The support has been across 149 Primary settings and 13 Secondary schools Support has comprised of direct requests from schools, as well as REDS and Reintegration Team referrals from the DCC Inclusion Team Service The team have made advice contributions to 69 statutory assessment of needs Team members have supported over 325 TAF meetings as well as numerous planning, progress and review meetings Attendance and support at annual reviews Supported Independent Review Panels by fulfilling the SEN Expert role



Physical & Sensory Impairment Teams

- We provide assessments, advice and support for children & young people with hearing impairment (HI), visual impairment (VI), multi-sensory impairment (MSI) or a physical disability (PD)
- We have a team of highly qualified and experienced specialist advisory teachers, Teachers of the Deaf (ToD), braillists, BSL users and Deaf inclusion workers
- We support from birth to 25 and support across pre-school, primary, secondary, post 16 and Special school

Impact of Covid-19

During Covid-19 all SEND & Inclusion teams;

- reviewed and prioritised caseload, making contact with schools and settings to support planning for individual learners
- Provided advice and support for school staff, children/young people and their families where helpful, helping to make sure that contact was maintained and all of our children remained safe
- Provided a direct response to schools and families and contributed to TAC/TAF meetings using virtual platforms
- Worked with the local learning communities and with DCC to ensure timely advice and updates for learners with SEND



Impact of Covid-19

- We participated in a co-ordinated response to the pandemic, working with Early Help and with DCC via the One Devon approach. This aimed to ensure that schools, children and families experienced there being "no wrong front door" as a result of professionals either responding directly or passing the request/ concern on to the person or service best placed to respond, without any necessity for a further referral process
- As part of this, we contributed to the daily Early Help triage, to Locality Partnership meetings, to EH strategic meetings and to the weekly One Devon problem solving forum



Impact of Covid-19: Moving forward

SEND Transformation Project

DCC & NHS Devon Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) intend to transform the experience of CYP & families with SEND, through partnership working by co-designing and co-developing a new service model & partnership, which will:

- Ensure that children, young people and families get the right support, in the right place at the right time;
- Secure the best possible outcomes for CYP;
- Communicate with CYP & families so they feel listened to & to have influenced services and schools; and
- Ensure a smooth transition into adulthood that supports independence and personal agency.

It will deliver better value for money. It will instil full partnership working across the CCG & DCC with partners, so that families only have to tell their story once and feel they are working with 'one team'. This will strengthen trust & confidence between families & the system & between different parts of the system.
