Simple 'tried and tested' strategies to make your classroom more inclusive that take:


- Less time
- ► Less effort
- Less stress

► Useful for all children



Consistent routines and practices:

- ► The first few minutes
- ► Clear and consistent routines
- ► Visual timetable
- ► The last few minutes



Focus:

- Seating plan
- Sitting comfortably
- Less is more approach to displays
- ► Fiddle toys
- ► Task planners with motivators
- ► Noise / other sensory issues
- ► Adult check-ins



Access:

Scaffolds:

- Breaking the lesson into small chunks
- Modelling
- Pre-teaching
- Check for understanding
- Writing frame/structure
- ► Additional visuals/ concrete apparatus
